PLASTICS, GLASS & CANS (Please empty & rinse!)



Plastics (1 – 7) including bottles & jugs (leave lids on); plastic food trays & cups; wide-mouth containers (lids on); rigid plastics (buckets, toys, etc.)



Glass bottles & jars (lids removed); metal food cans; aerosol cans

PAPER & CARDBOARD



Flattened cardboard, cartons, pizza & food boxes; newspapers & magazines; junk mail & mixed paper of all kinds

NO plastic bags, shredded paper, pots, pans, glassware, paper plates, paper cups, napkins, paper towels, plastic cutlery & plates (#6), food, Styrofoam, batteries, light bulbs, wire hangers or ceramics.

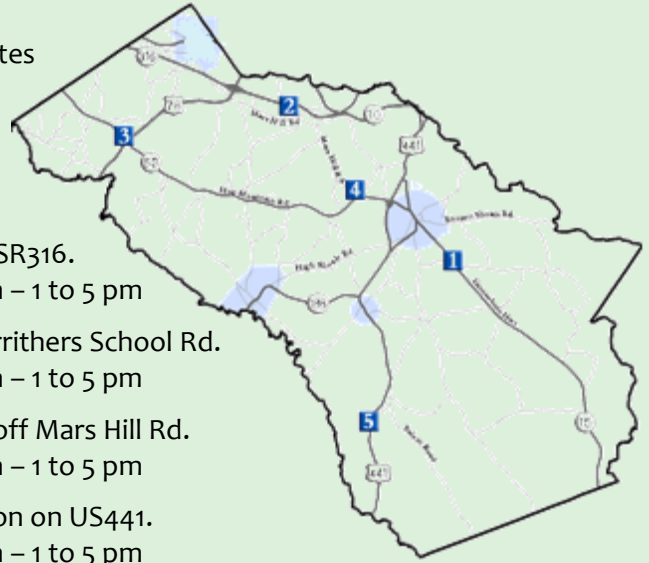

OCONEE COUNTY WASTE COLLECTION & RECYCLING SITES

PLEASE NOTE: All sites are closed on Tuesdays and Thursdays. All sites are fenced and lighted with attendants present.

1. **Greensboro Highway (SR15)** ~ 2001 Greensboro Highway at Green Ferry Rd. HOURS: Mon, Wed, Fri – 8 am to 5 pm; Sat – 9 am to 4 pm; Sun – 1 to 5 pm
2. **Mars Hill Area/Jimmy Daniell Road** ~ Jimmy Daniell Road near SR316. HOURS: Mon, Wed, Fri – 8 am to 5 pm; Sat – 9 am to 4 pm; Sun – 1 to 5 pm
3. **Hog Mountain Road (SR53)** ~ intersection of Hog Mtn Rd & Carrithers School Rd. HOURS: Mon, Wed, Fri – 8 am to 5 pm; Sat – 9 am to 4 pm; Sun – 1 to 5 pm
4. **Rankin Road** ~ across from Oconee County Middle School just off Mars Hill Rd. HOURS: Mon, Wed, Fri – 8 am to 5 pm; Sat – 9 am to 4 pm; Sun – 1 to 5 pm
5. **Macon Highway (former landfill)** ~ one mile south of Farmington on US441. HOURS: Mon, Wed, Fri – 8 am to 5 pm; Sat – 9 am to 4 pm; Sun – 1 to 5 pm
